For the adventurous traveller, this 10-night tour will get you to not only the west coast of Korea where you'll visit the industrial city of **Nampo**, but you'll also head north to the lively city of **Pyongsong** where you will meet the incredibly talented students at a local school, get across to the east coast where you'll tour the fascinating seaside city **Wonsan**,

You will have the opportunity to join in a Taekwondo class at North Korea's national Taekwondo training centre, learning the martial art of Korea from the masters, a great opportunity for some exercise and interactions with the locals.

We'll also be in Pyongyang for one of the country's most important dates of the year – The Day of the Sun, birthday of Eternal President Kim Il-Sung. Expect a day of merriment for the locals as they enjoy their day off celebrating with picnics in parks, participating in mass dancing events, and then gathering together at Kim Il Sung Square to watch the fireworks display at night.

This tour also includes a comprehensive tour of Pyongyang featuring all the important sights such as the <u>Fatherland Liberation War Museum</u> and the captured spy ship the USS Pueblo, the deep underground <u>Pyongyang Metro</u>, and shopping with the locals at <u>Kwangbok Supermarket</u>.

Plus so much more!

Of course, you'll also head south to <u>Kaesong</u> and the DMZ, where North and South Korea continue their face-off.

The Pyongyang Marathon is a World Athletics' Bronze Label Road Race, and also has AIMS Certification. Join the race and receive the most unique finisher's medal, running shirt, and race certificates available.

Even if you're not a serious runner, the Pyongyang Marathon is an event like no other. It starts and ends in Kim II Sung Stadium - a stadium filled with over 50,000 North Koreans cheering you on as you finish your race. It's an experience like no other.

DAILY ITINERARY

APRIL 12 - FRIDAY

Pre-Tour Briefing | We require all travelers to attend a pre-tour briefing that covers regulations, etiquette, safety, and practicalities for travel in North Korea. The briefing lasts approximately one hour followed by a question and answer session. Please be punctual for the briefing. You can come early, meet your fellow travelers, pay any outstanding tour fees and browse our collection of Korean art. A proper briefing is an essential part of travel to North Korea.

For Pyongyang Marathon tours, we will hold several briefings - in the morning for those departing by train in the afternoon, and in the afternoon for those departing by flight the next day.

AM

- Recommended latest arrival in Beijing.
- 10:00 | Train Departure your briefing will be held at this time in Beijing

PM

- 14:00 / 16:00 / 18:00 | Flight Departure briefings will be held in the afternoon on this day in Beijing at these times, you only need to attend one briefing (exact times offered to be confirmed.
- 17:00 | Train travellers depart Beijing Station by domestic sleeper train to Dandong, the Chinese city on the border with the DPRK. Please arrange independent travel to the train station and arrive at least an hour and a half early for the train departure.

Overnight | Hotel in Beijing not included in the tour for those taking the flight the next day. Contact us for recommendations near our office! Those travelling by train will spend the night on the train.



APRIL 13 - SATURDAY

Arrival day in Pyongyang

AM

- Train transfer at Dandong Station from overnight sleeper train to the Dandong-Pyongyang local train. Our local representative in Dandong will assist with the transfer. Train crosses the China-North Korea border followed by North Korean customs and immigration.
- Free bus from the Koryo Tours office to Beijing Capital Airport Terminal 2. Exact time TBC at the pre-tour briefing. Alternatively, meet the group at the Air Koryo check-in counter.

PM

- Flight departure from Beijing on **Air Koryo flight JS152** at 12:00 pm. *A 2 hour flight with basic lunch. Flight times are subject to change*
- Arrival to Pyongyang's Sunan International Airport (FNJ). DPRK
 immigration and customs, meet your Korean guides and transfer to the
 city.
- Train arrival to Pyongyang Railway Station expected at 6:45 pm.
- <u>Kim II Sung Stadium</u> & Marathon Route Preview | Visit the stadium where you will start and finish your race, and then drive the marathon route to familiarise yourself with the roads, turning points and toilet stops.
- Yanggakdo International Cinema Optional screening of Run and Run, a DPRK film about marathon runner Yong Ho who faces the physical and mental struggles of marathon participation. After both his father and work unit manager tell him to stop running, he becomes more determined to achieve his marathon dream. The film will be shown at the Pyongyang International House of Cinema (80 RMB entry fee paid on the spot). A Koryo Tours exclusive and sure to provide you with motivation ahead of the big event!

Overnight

Yanggakdo International Hotel, Pyongyang | Home away from home for most (but not all!) foreign visitors to Pyongyang, this 47-story hotel is located on an island in the middle of the Taedong River and offers great views of the city. Comfortable rooms and comprehensive leisure facilities: swimming pool, spa, billiards, bowling, gift shops, tea houses and beer brewed on-site.



APRIL 14 - SUNDAY

The big event! The Pyongyang Marathon 2024!

AM

The 2024 Pyongyang Marathon | this is your chance to run the streets of Pyongyang in the DPRK's largest annual sports event! Join the Full Marathon, Half Marathon, 10km or 5km race — all of which follow a return course that starts and ends in <u>Kim II Sung Stadium</u> in front of a 50,000-strong capacity crowd of local Koreans. (<u>runner's guide to Kim II Sung Stadium</u>)

The full route, which has been certified by both the IAAF and AIMS, leads right through the city centre, past a number of iconic landmarks, and then out into Pyongyang's less urban districts. Don't miss this incredible opportunity to see more of the capital and interact with people along the course. Prizes are available for the winners of each race.

PM

- Shower, resting time and lunch | After the ending ceremony of the marathon, we'll be heading back to the hotel to recharge, shower and rest.
- Munsu Water Park | We'll take a break at this outdoor and indoor water park with water slides, lap pools, and hot tubs. Bar, coffee shop, and shops for non-swimmers (Entry fee 2 EUR; swimming fee- 10 EUR with suit rental; tennis- 5 EUR).
- Local Beer Bar | Relax at one of Pyongyang's local bars to wrap up an exciting day.

APRIL 15 – MONDAY

Pyongyang

The Day of the Sun – one of the DPRK's largest holidays. April 15, 2024, is the 112th anniversary of President Kim II Sung's birth

On April 15th there may be large-scale celebrations in Pyongyang. A Military Parade is possible, in which case the itinerary for the day will be subject to change. Foreign travellers are typically allowed to view military units as they exit the city from the parade course and the city's residents come out en masse to greet them. Be prepared to potentially wait around for a few hours, but it will be well worth it.



For The Day of the Sun we also expect student-organised mass dances at prominent locations throughout the city and the possibility of evening fireworks. Whatever happens this holiday, it will be impressive and unforgettable. Not to be missed!

AM

- We start this day with a guided walk around Pyongyang see some street life, some little known spots, unvisited monuments and landmarks - wear some good shoes for this very unusual way to experience the capital city of the DPRK on a major national holiday.
- Moranbong Park | We'll take a stroll and have picnic lunch in Pyongyang's
 central park popular with locals for picnics, dances, and sports. The park is
 filled with historic pavilions, walls, and monuments- modern and ancient, a
 few of which are among the traditional 'Eight Great Sights of Pyongyang'.

PM

- Kimilsungia and Kimjongillia Flower Exhibition | Exhibit of the two
 flowers named after the DPRK's leaders and held on the occasion of their
 respective birthday anniversaries in February and April. See organizations
 and groups from across society compete to put on the best floral display.
- Artistic Performance | Expect to see a performance on the day, while the
 type of performance is to be confirmed we have been able to see <u>circus</u>,
 musical and other performances on this day, typically 20-50 EUR per
 person depending on nature of performance.
- Mass Dance | Large student organised dances held around Pyongyang on major holidays (*weather dependent*). Join in the fun!
- Fireworks over the Taedong River | watch with thousands of locals in Kim II Sung Square as this holiday comes to an end. Wonderful mingling opportunities in a festive atmosphere

APRIL 16 - TUESDAY

Pyongyang City Tour & Kaesong

AM

- Tower of the Juche Idea | Iconic tower dedicated to the DPRK's guiding philosophy on the Taedong River. Take the elevator to the top for great views of the city (elevator ticket is 5 EUR).
- Kim Il Sung Square | Pyongyang's central square lined with government ministries, museums, and The Grand People's Study House.
- Foreign Languages Bookshop | Store selling Korean publications translated into English, German, French, Russian, Chinese, and Spanish. Also pick up DVDs, postcards, and small works of art.
- Okryugwan | A meal at Pyongyang's most famous restaurant. Housed in a huge traditional building on the banks of the Taedong River. Okryugwan specialises in Pyongyang Cold Noodles.

PM

- Heading for <u>Kaesong</u> Drive south along the <u>Reunification Highway</u> to the historic capital of the <u>Koryo Dynasty</u> (918-1392) and today located near the Korean Demilitarised Zone.
- Monument to the Three-Charters of National Reunification | Iconic arch over the Pyongyang-Kaesong Highway dedicated to joint meeting between Koreas, north and south. Also known as the 'Arch of Reunification'.
- Sariwon Folk Village and City View | Mock-up of a traditional Korean town which includes a history museum, food street, and pavilions. There is a small tavern selling *Makkoli*, traditional rice wine. Climb a nearby hill for a view of Sariwon City and the surrounding plains.
- Drive on to Kaesong City
- Old City Walk and South Gate | A stroll from the hotel through Kaesong's historic district lined with homes dating back to the Ri Dynasty from the city's historic South Gate.

Overnight | Minsok Folk Hotel, Kaesong. Traditional style hotel where guests sleep on heated floors in Korean style. Housed in beautiful courtyards of Kaesong's old city, structures date back to the Ri Dynasty. Basic bathroom facilities. Hot water not guaranteed and erratic electricity supply – please bring a torch.



APRIL 17 - WEDNESDAY

Kaesong and the DMZ, return to Pyongyang

AM

- Panmunjom Armistice Village and DMZ | The site of the signing of the
 1953 armistice that ended the Korean War and the demarcation line
 between north and south. On some days it is possible to visit the hut
 straddling the line, where negotiations between both sides once took place.
 Here we will be accompanied by military guides from the Korean People's
 Army.
- <u>Kaesong Koryo Museum</u> | Once the Songgyung Academy, a Confucian school, and now a museum on the Koryo Dynasty exhibiting historical objects, statues, pagodas, and porcelain from that era. A UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Kaesong Korean Stamp Exhibition Hall | Store selling stamps, postcards, local ginseng, souvenirs, art, and more! One of the best postcard collections in/ the country and friendly staff.
- Traditional Royal Korean Lunch (pangsanggi) | A meal consisting of 12 dishes served in brass bowls fit for the kings of old. The more dishes, the more distinguished the guest! Traditional Korean 'sweet-meat soup' is also an option here (+5 EUR).

РМ

- Pakyon Waterfall | Light walking with a picnic lunch in a relaxing wooded area. Local people commonly visit here for picnics and sometimes swimming in the series of pools above the falls.
- **Gwanum Temple** | Located a 30-minute hike, above Pakyon Waterfalls, the temple dates back more than a thousand years and is dedicated to the Buddhist Bodhisattva of Mercy. There is an ornate marble Bodhisattva statue the nearby cave. The current building dates back to the Ri Dynasty and has an interesting tale associated with its construction.
- Tomb of King Wanggon | Resting place of the founder of the Koryo Dynasty, who died in 943. The tomb is largely reconstructed after looting by the Japanese occupiers and general disrepair. A UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- **Return to Pyongyang** | a 3-hour drive to get us back to the capital in time for evening drinks ahead of the major holiday coming up the next day.

APRIL 18 - THURSDAY

Pyongyang

AM

- President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II lie in state and the most solemn location on the itinerary. Please note formal dress is required. Men require collared shirt with tie, dark non-jean pants, and dark shoes. Women require covered shoulders, knee-length dress or pants, and closed toed shoes. The visit will take most of the morning and visitors are asked to bow a number of times inside. This is a state-administered site and visits are subject to local conditions. Cancellations are rare but possible.
- Mansudae Fountain Park | The historic centre of Pyongyang popular with local citizens after school and on weekends. Flanked by examples of ancient, socialist, and modern architecture.
- Mansudae Grand Monument | Enormous bronze statues of President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II overlooking downtown Pyongyang. A presentation of flowers and bow by the group is customary here (5 EUR). Please note this is a government-administered sight and visits are subject to cancellation. Visits are optional and require a certain dress code (close-toed shoes and covered legs and shoulders). Here we will also see the Chollima Monument, or 'thousand ri (400 km or 250 mile) horse' -a symbol of speed- commemorating the quick rebuilding of the country in the 1950s following the Korean War

PM

- Victorious Fatherland Liberation War Museum | Tour this world-class museum led by a local museum guide. Renovated in 2012 and it exhibits the Korean War from the DPRK perspective containing artefacts, documents, photos, and lifelike dioramas. The exterior grounds house the War Victory Monument and displays of Korean People's Army Hero Equipment and captured equipment from the US military, including the USS Pueblo. Central to the understanding of the country today and highlight of the trip.
- Pyongyang Metro Tour | One of the deepest metro systems in the world with stunning artwork reflecting the name of each station. Ride six stations on the Chollima Line.



- Arch of Triumph | A massive archway made for the 70th anniversary of the birth of President Kim II Sung in 1982 and commemorating the liberation of Korea from Japanese colonial rule in 1945. Larger than its counterpart in Paris.
- Taekwondo Class | A 60 minute introductory class at the Taekwondo Arena on Sports Street in taekwondo, the national martial art, which all children learn to a certain degree in school.

Overnight | Yanggakdo Hotel, Pyongyang.

APRIL 19 - FRIDAY

Nampo & Pyongsong

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- Nampo | Drive west along the 'Youth Hero Highway' to this port city of Pyongyang on the Taedong River estuary. A 45 minute to 1-hour drive.
- Chongsam-ri Co-operative Farm | The DPRK's most famous and iconic model farm. Visited hundreds of times by Kim II Sung, the place where the 'Chongsam-ri Method' was developed (they will explain on-site). See how the farming system works, visit a farmhouse, the local shop, kindergarten and see the fields and greenhouses.
- Local Factory | Nampo is a major industrial area of the DPRK, we'll visit one of the local factories to see and learn more about the industrial side of the country. We will visit either a glass factory, mineral water bottling plant or if we're lucky the famous Chollima Steelworks. Please note that factory visits may depend on on-site activities/conditions.
- West Sea Barrage | An 8 km concrete, steel, and earthen barrage
 constructed between the <u>Taedong River</u> estuary and the West Sea for land
 reclamation, irrigation, flood prevention, and power generation. It also acts
 as a ship lock and fish ladder. One of the DPRK's greatest engineering feats.
- Lunch | At a local restaurant in Nampo

PM

• Pyongyang | Return to the capital city. A 45 minute to 1-hour drive.



- Mangyongdae Native House | Birthplace of and childhood home of President Kim II Sung. A traditional Korean house in a park-like setting.
- <u>Kwangbok Department Store</u> | Opportunity to use <u>Korean currency</u> and shop with the citizens of Pyongyang! Try the snack stand on the first floor for some of Pyongyang's best local eats.
- Pyongsong | Drive north of Pyongyang to the capital of South Pyongan Province. A 45 minute to 1-hour drive.

Overnight

Jangsusan Hotel, Pyongsong | The only hotel in Pyongsong open for tourists and one of the most fun in the whole country! Basic facilities with fairly reliable electricity and hot water. One of the best bartenders in the country mans the bar. Billiards, karaoke, hairdresser, and outdoor eateries in summer.

APRIL 20 - SATURDAY

Pyongsong & Pyongyang

AM

- **Pyongsong City Square** | Central square of Pyongsong City with statues of the DPRK leadership and flanked by the provincial revolutionary museum. Presentation of flowers customary.
- <u>Kim Jong Suk Higher Middle School</u> | One of the DPRK's top middle schools for gifted students, tourists are encouraged to help teach an English class!
- Konji-ri Revolutionary Site | Location of the headquarters of the Korean People's Army & home of Kim II Sung during the Korean War. Tour the renovated buildings and learn about life there during the war.
- Pyongyang | Drive south back to Pyongyang A 45 minute to 1-hour drive.

PM

• Grand People's Study House | Huge national library and public university housed in a large neo-traditional Korean building overlooking Kim Il Sung Square and the downtown Pyongyang.



- Pyongyang Schoolchildren's Palace | Tour of one of Pyongyang's centres of extracurricular excellence with study rooms for fine arts, dance, sports, and music, then watch a spectacular performance put on by the students.
- <u>Duck Barbecue Restaurant</u> | South Pyongyang's famous grilled duck restaurant.

Overnight | Yanggakdo Hotel, Pyongyang.

APRIL 21 - SUNDAY

Wonsan City and Korea's East Coast

AM

- Wonsan | Drive east across the width of the peninsula to a major port city, stopping at scenic spots along the way. A 4-hour drive.
- <u>Sinpyong Lake Rest Stop</u> | Known as 'Little Kumgang' this scenic lakeside rest stop is a welcome break on the rough road!.
- <u>Ulim Waterfall</u> | Hidden amongst the mountains on the road to Wonsan, 'Echo' Waterfall is a scenic stopover to enjoy lunch, stretch your legs, or go for a dip in the pool beneath.

PM

- Wonsan Agricultural University | The DPRK's premier agricultural
 university set among beautiful hillside scenery. Tour the grounds and the
 neo-Romanesque teaching hall, originally built by Germans living in the
 area in the early 20th century.
- Songdowon International Schoolchildren's Camp | A classic socialist summer camp where Korean and international children can spend two weeks learning socialist values and teamwork. Tour the recently renovated dormitories, aquarium, birdhouse, gymnasium, and more!
- Kangwon Province Art Gallery | Small art exhibition selling artwork by local artists.
- Jangdok Island and Lighthouse | Take a stroll on the breakwater to a small island in the middle of Wonsan harbour (1 EUR/USD entry fee).

Overnight



<u>Dongmyong Hotel, Wonsan</u> | Waterfront hotel with stunning seaside views of Wonsan Harbor. Limited hours of hot water, bar, billiards, ping-pong, barber shop, beauty salon, dry-sauna, and indoor seawater swimming pool.

APRIL 22 - MONDAY

More Wonsan, then return to Pyongyang

AM

- <u>Wonsan Old Railway Station</u> | A Revolutoary site in the heart of the city, see a lovely old station, steam train, and a tale of how crucial to the revolution this place was
- Wonsan City Centre and Docks | Central square and ship terminal in downtown Wonsan.
- Mangyongbong-92 | A ferry/cruise ship built in 1992 to ferry Japanese Koreans and goods between Japan and North Korea till 2006. In 2018, the ship carried North Korean performers for the Winter Olympics in South Korea.
- **Sokwang Temple** | A real treat, a very rarely visited beautiful temple. Be one of only a handful of tourists ever to set eyes on this place!

PM

- Lunch in Wonsan
- Continue drive back to Pyongyang, with stop at Sinpyong Rest House. A 4hour drive.
- Golden Lane Bowling Centre | Where Pyongyang locals go for their ten-pin fix (2.5 EUR per person per game). Also has billiards and arcade games. Non-bowlers can head next door to the Kumrung Leisure Centre for an airgun shooting range (approximately 6 EUR per 20 round cartridge) and some of the best coffee in Pyongyang.
- Haeyang Restaurant | Farewell dinner at one of Pyongyang's famous restaurants.

Overnight | Yanggakdo International Hotel, Pyongyang.



APRIL 23 - TUESDAY

Departure Day from Pyongyang and Return to Beijing by flight or train.

Flight departure from Pyongyang on **Air Koryo** with an expected arrival at Beijing Capital Airport (PEK) Terminal 2 by midday.

OR

Train departure by **local train to the Korean-Chinese border** at 10:25, transfer in **Dandong** and onward travel to Beijing with scheduled arrival to **Beijing Station** on Wednesday, April 24th at 08:30 am. *For this tour the default option is hard sleeper* (six beds per berth).
