4 nights in North Korea + Beijing-Pyongyang travel time OVERVIEW

Visit North Korea for New Year's Eve 2020 and bring in 2021 with Koryo Tours in style. Our annual New Year's Eve Tour counts down the clock with the locals in Pyongyang's <u>Kim II</u> <u>Sung Square</u> for celebrations that only get better every year.

Last year saw a massive firework display over the <u>Tower of the Juche Idea</u>, dancing, and drone display in the sky. All topped off with a concert by some of <u>North Korea's most</u> <u>famous musicians.</u>

Watched closely by North Koreans and analysts alike, be one of the first to hear the New Year's Address for 2021. This is given by the North Korean leader on New Year's Day and outlines the country's policy and initiatives for the coming year, providing insight into where the country is going. We'll also visit the highlights of <u>Pyongyang</u> such as the <u>Kumsusan</u> <u>Palace of the Sun</u>, Mausoleum of the DPRK leaders, and the <u>Pyongyang Metro</u>. This tour also includes a <u>DMZ</u> tour at Panmunjom in <u>Kaesong</u>.

DAILY ITINERARY

NOVEMBER 16 – MONDAY

Briefing Day and Train Departure Day

***Pre-Tour Briefing |** We require all travellers to attend a pre-tour briefing that covers regulations, etiquette, safety, and practicalities for travel in North Korea. The briefing lasts approximately one hour, followed by a question and answers session. Please be punctual for the briefing. You can come early, meet your fellow travellers, pay any outstanding tour fees and browse our collection of Korean art. A proper presentation is an essential part of travel to North Korea.

For this tour, we will hold two briefings. One in the morning for those departing by train this afternoon and the other in the afternoon for those leaving by flight the next day.

AM

- Recommended latest arrival in Beijing.
- 10:00 | briefing for those departing by train.

PM

- 16:00 | briefing for those departing by flight.
- **17:27** | **Train travellers depart Beijing Station** by domestic sleeper train to <u>Dandong</u>, the Chinese city on the border with the DPRK. Please arrange independent travel to the train station and arrive at least an hour and a half early for the train departure.

Overnight | Hotel in Beijing not included in the tour for those taking the flight the next day. Contact us for recommendations near our office! Those travelling by train will spend the night on the train.



NOVEMBER 17 – TUESDAY

Arrival day in Pyongyang

AM

- **Train transfer at Dandong Station** from overnight sleeper train to Dandong-Pyongyang local. *Our local representative in Dandong will assist with the transfer. The train crosses the China-North Korea border followed by North Korean customs and immigration.*
- **Free bus** from the Koryo Tours office to Beijing Capital Airport Terminal 2 for those taking the flight. *Exact time TBC at the pre-tour briefing. Alternatively, meet the group at the Air Koryo check-in counter.*

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- Flight departure from Beijing on **Air Koryo flight JS 152** at 12:55. *A 1.5-hour flight with basic lunch (no vegetarian option).*
- Flight arrival into <u>Pyongyang's Sunan International Airport</u> (FNJ) at 15:55. DPRK immigration and customs, meet your Korean guides and transfer to the city.
- Walk on post-war Pyongyang's oldest street Victory (Sungni) Street from Kim Il Sung Square to Pyongyang Railway Station.
- Train arrival to Pyongyang Railway Station at 18:45.

Overnight | <u>Changgwangsan Hotel</u>, Pyongyang. A centrally located classic hotel built in the 1970s and within walking distance of some attractions. It has a large indoor swimming pool, a great bookstore and coffee shops.

NOVEMBER 18 – WEDNESDAY

Kaesong City and DMZ Tour

AM

- <u>Kaesong</u> | Drive south along the '<u>Reunification Highway</u>' to the historic capital of the <u>Koryo Dynasty</u> (918-1392) and today located near the Korean Demilitarised Zone. *A 3-hour drive*
- <u>Panmunjom Armistice Village and DMZ</u> | Perhaps the most famous place in the entire country. The iconic manifestation of the tragic division between North and South Korea. The 'truce' village where several huts straddle the Central Military



Demarcation Line (de facto border) with soldiers from each side standing guard. A tour here starts with a briefing at the edge of the DMZ, a visit to the Armistice Negotiation Hall and Armistice Signing Hall, seen as symbols of victory over foreign aggression on this side of the line. Then to Panmunjom itself – cross the border inside one of the blue huts, experience the uncanny feeling of crossing the front line of a sad and needless division of one society, and then take a higher view from the Panmun Pavilion looking over the line from above. A Korean People's Army officer will be there to explain their side of things and will willingly pose for some photos too. A completely and utterly unmissable place.

- <u>Kaesong Koryo Museum</u> | Once the Songgyung Academy, a Confucian school, and now a museum on the Koryo Dynasty exhibiting historical objects, statues, pagodas, and porcelain from that era. A UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- <u>Kaesong Korean Stamp Exhibition Hall</u> | Store selling stamps, postcards, local *ginseng*, souvenirs, art, and more! One of the best postcard collections in/ the country and friendly staff.
- <u>Traditional Royal Korean Lunch (*pangsanggi*)</u> A meal consisting of 12 dishes served in brass bowls fit for the kings of old. The more dishes, the more distinguished the guest! Traditional Korean 'sweet-meat soup' is also an option here (+5 EUR).

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- Janam Hill and Old City View | Statues of the DPRK leadership on a hill overlooking Kaesong city and historic pavilion used for archery demonstrations in days of yore.
- We'll drive around two hours to <u>Sariwon City and Folk village</u> | Recently built mockup of a traditional Korean walled city which includes a history museum, food street and pavilions. Make sure to try the homemade makkoli here!
- Drive back to Pyongyang. 1 hour.
- <u>Mangyongdae Native House</u> | Birthplace of and childhood home of President Kim Il Sung. A traditional Korean house in a park-like setting.
- <u>Kwangbok Department Store</u> | Opportunity to use <u>Korean currency</u> and shop with the citizens of Pyongyang! Try the snack stand on the first floor for some of Pyongyang's best local eats.
- <u>Yanggakdo International Cinema</u> | Optional *Screening of Comrade Kim Goes Flying*, a North Korean romantic comedy co-produced by Koryo Tours. The ticket is approximately 10 EUR (*subject to change*).

NOVEMBER 19 – THURSDAY

Pyongyang City Tour

AM

- <u>Kumsusan Palace of the Sun</u> | Mausoleum of the DPRK leadership where President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II lie in state and the most solemn location on the itinerary. *Please note formal dress is required. Men require collared shirt with tie, dark non-jean pants, and dark shoes. Women need covered shoulders, knee-length dress or pants, and closed-toed shoes. The visit will take most of the morning, and visitors are asked to bow several times inside. This is a state-administered site and visits are subject to local conditions. Cancellations are rare but possible.*
- Mansudae Grand Monument | Enormous bronze statues of President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II overlooking downtown Pyongyang. A presentation of flowers and bow by the group is customary here (5 EUR). *Please note this is a governmentadministered sight and visits are subject to cancellation. Visits are optional and require a specific dress code (close-toed shoes and covered legs and shoulders)*. Here we will also see the <u>Chollima Monument</u>, or 'thousand ri (400 km or 250 miles) horse' -a symbol of speed- commemorating the quick rebuilding of the country in the 1950s following the Korean War.
- <u>Foreign Languages Bookshop</u> | Store selling Korean publications translated into English, German, French, Russian, Chinese, and Spanish. Also pick up DVDs, postcards, and small works of art.
- <u>Kim II Sung Square</u> | Pyongyang's central square lined with government ministries, museums, and The Grand People's Study House.

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- <u>Victorious Fatherland Liberation War Museum</u> | Tour this world-class museum led by a local museum guide. Renovated in 2012 and it exhibits the Korean War from the DPRK perspective containing artefacts, documents, photos, and lifelike dioramas. The exterior grounds house the War Victory Monument and displays of Korean People's Army Hero Equipment and captured equipment from the US military, including the <u>USS Pueblo</u>. Central to the understanding of the country today and a highlight of the trip.
- <u>Monument to Party Foundation</u> | Iconic structure featuring the hammer, sickle, writing brush which represent the workers, farmers, and intellectuals that make up the Worker's Party of Korea.



- <u>Tower of the Juche Idea</u> | Iconic tower dedicated to the DPRK's guiding philosophy on the Taedong River. Take the elevator to the top for great views of the city (*elevator ticket is 5 EUR*).
- <u>Drive north</u> passing rivers valleys and hills to <u>Mt. Myohyang</u>, the 'mountain of mysterious fragrance'. *A 2.5 hour to 3-hour drive*.

Overnight | <u>Huichon Hotel</u>, Huichon. Basic but clean hotel located 30 minutes north of Mt. Myohyang. Delicious local food is much different from the lowlands, on-site sauna, and limited electricity. A must for those wishing to visit every province in the DPRK as it is situated just across the border into the otherwise tourist-devoid Jagang Province.

NOVEMBER 20 – FRIDAY

Mt Myohyang and Pyongyang Metro

AM

- International Friendship Exhibition | An exhibition hall displaying gifts of all kinds given to the DPRK leaders by foreign states, leaders, and organizations. The exhibition is a fascinating look into the material culture in the second half of the 20th century. Highlights include a plane given by the Soviet Union, basketball signed by Michael Jordan from the US State Department, and vodka given by Dennis Rodman. The visit takes most of the morning.
- **Pohyon Buddhist Temple** | A peaceful temple dating back to 1042 with stone pagoda and repository of a print blocks and historic text of the *Tripitaka Koreana*, Buddhist scriptures first produced to invoke divine assistance from foreign invasion during the Koryo Dynasty.

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- <u>Manpok Valley Walk</u> A gentle stroll passing waterfalls, interesting rocks, lovely wooded areas and viewing points.
- Drive back to Pyongyang. 2.5 3-hour drive.
- **Pyongyang Metro Tour** | One of the deepest metro systems in the world with stunning artwork reflecting the name of each station. Ride six stations on the Chollima Line.
- <u>Arch of Triumph</u> | A massive archway made for the 70th anniversary of the birth of President Kim II Sung in 1982 and commemorating the liberation of Korea from Japanese colonial rule in 1945. Larger than its counterpart in Paris.



• Farewell group dinner at the <u>Golden Lanes Bowling Centre</u>'s bulgogi BBQ restaurant.

NOVEMBER 21 – SATURDAY

Departure Day from Pyongyang and Return to Beijing by flight or train. Please confirm your preferred transport method upon booking*

AM

• Flight departure from Pyongyang on **Air Koryo Flight JS151** at 08:35 with scheduled arrival at Beijing Capital Airport (PEK) Terminal 2 at 09:50.

OR

• Train departure by **train to Beijing** at 10:25 with a transfer in Dandong. The scheduled arrival is to **Beijing Station** on Sunday, November 22, at 08:40. *For this tour, the default option is hard sleeper (six beds per berth).*

End of Tour
