5 nights in North Korea for New Year's Eve + Beijing-Pyongyang travel time OVERVIEW

Visit North Korea for New Year's Eve 2021 and bring in 2022 with Koryo Tours in style. Our annual New Year's Eve Tour counts down the clock with the locals in Pyongyang's <u>Kim II</u> <u>Sung Square</u> for celebrations that only get better every year.

Recent years have seen a massive firework display over the <u>Tower of the Juche Idea</u>, dancing, and drone display in the sky. All topped off with a concert by some of <u>North Korea's</u> <u>most famous musicians</u>.

Watched closely by North Koreans and analysts alike, be one of the first to hear the New Year's Address for 2022. This is given by the North Korean leader on New Year's Day and outlines the country's policy and initiatives for the coming year, providing insight into where the country is going. We'll also visit the highlights of Pyongyang such as the <u>Kumsusan</u> Palace of the Sun, mausoleum of the DPRK leaders, and the <u>Pyongyang Metro</u>. This tour also includes a <u>DMZ</u> tour at Panmunjom in <u>Kaesong</u>.

DAILY ITINERARY

DECEMBER 29 – WEDNESDAY

Briefing Day and Train Departure Day

***Pre-Tour Briefing |** We require all travellers to attend a pre-tour briefing that covers regulations, etiquette, safety, and practicalities for travel in North Korea. The briefing lasts approximately one hour followed by a question and answer session. Please be punctual for the briefing. You can come early, meet your fellow travellers, pay any outstanding tour fees and browse our collection of Korean art. A proper briefing is an essential part of travel to North Korea.

For this tour, we will hold two briefings. One in the morning for those departing by train this afternoon and the other in the afternoon for those departing by flight the next day.

AM

- Recommended latest arrival in Beijing.
- 10:00 | Briefing for those departing by train.

PM

- 16:00 | Briefing for those departing by flight.
- **17:27** | **Train travellers depart Beijing Station** by domestic sleeper train to <u>Dandong</u>, the Chinese city on the border with the DPRK. Please arrange independent travel to the train station and arrive at least an hour and a half early for the train departure.

Overnight | Hotel in Beijing not included in the tour for those taking the flight the next day. Contact us for recommendations near our office! Those travelling by train will spend the night on the train.

DECEMBER 30 – THURSDAY

Arrival day in Pyongyang

AM

• Train transfer at Dandong Station from overnight sleeper train to Dandong-Pyongyang local. Our local representative in Dandong will assist with the transfer.



Train crosses the China-North Korea border followed by North Korean customs and immigration.

• **Free bus** from the Koryo Tours office to Beijing Capital Airport Terminal 2 for those taking the flight. *Exact time TBC at the pre-tour briefing. Alternatively, meet the group at the Air Koryo check-in counter.*

- Flight departure from Beijing on **Air Koryo flight JS152** at 14:30. A 1.5 hour flight with basic lunch (no vegetarian option).
- Flight arrival to <u>Pyongyang's Sunan International Airport</u> (FNJ) at 15:55. DPRK immigration and customs, meet your Korean guides, and transfer to the city.
- <u>Arch of Triumph</u> | A massive archway made for the 70th anniversary of the birth of President Kim II Sung in 1982 and commemorating the liberation of Korea from Japanese colonial rule in 1945. Larger than its counterpart in Paris.
- Train arrival to Pyongyang Railway Station at 18:45.

Overnight | <u>Yanggakdo International Hotel</u>, Pyongyang | Home away from home for most (but not all!) foreign visitors to Pyongyang, this 47-story hotel is located on an island in the middle of the Taedong River and offers great views of the city. Comfortable rooms and comprehensive leisure facilities: swimming pool, spa, billiards, bowling, gift shops, tea houses and beer brewed on-site.

DECEMBER 31 – FRIDAY

New Year's Eve

AM

- <u>Nampo</u> | Drive west along the '<u>Youth Hero Highway</u>' to this port city of Pyongyang on the Taedong River estuary. *A 45 minute to 1-hour drive.*
- <u>Tae'an Glass Factory</u> | Factory producing glass and glass products for the domestic market. Watch the glass-making process from smelting to sheet-cutting and even try to break a sheet of strengthened glass.
- <u>West Sea Barrage</u> | An 8 km concrete, steel, and earthen barrage constructed between the <u>Taedong River</u> estuary and the West Sea for land reclamation, irrigation, flood prevention, and power generation. It also acts as a ship lock and fish ladder. One of the DPRK's greatest engineering feats.



• Return to Pyongyang for lunch at a Hamburger Restaurant (!)

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- <u>Kwangbok Department Store</u> | Opportunity to use <u>Korean currency</u> and shop with the citizens of Pyongyang! Try the snack stand on the first floor for some of Pyongyang's best local eats.
- <u>Mangyongdae Native House</u> | Birthplace of and childhood home of President Kim II Sung. A traditional Korean house in a park-like setting.
- <u>Victorious Fatherland Liberation War Museum</u> | Tour this world-class museum led by a local museum guide. Renovated in 2012 and it exhibits the Korean War from the DPRK perspective containing artefacts, documents, photos, and lifelike dioramas. The exterior grounds house the War Victory Monument and displays of Korean People's Army Hero Equipment and captured equipment from the US military, including the <u>USS Pueblo</u>. Central to the understanding of the country today and highlight of the trip.
- Mansugyo Beer Bar | A standing bar serving seven type of beer (50 cents a pint, 4.5 EUR for a flight). Popular with locals after work and on weekends!
- Dinner on Pyongyang's Rainbow Boat on the Taedong River where we'll start our New Year's Eve Party!
- Head for <u>Kim II Sung Square</u> before midnight along with crowds of tens of thousands of locals for a <u>North Korean New Year Celebration!</u> Concerts, midnight fireworks, and the best night of the year!

JANUARY 1 – SATURDAY

New Year's Day

AM

- **Pyongyang Metro Tour** | One of the deepest metro systems in the world with stunning artwork reflecting the name of each station. Ride six stations on the Chollima Line.
- <u>Mansudae Fountain Park</u> | The historic centre of Pyongyang popular with local citizens afterschool and on weekends. Flanked by examples of ancient, socialist, and modern architecture.





- Mansudae Grand Monument | Enormous bronze statues of President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II overlooking downtown Pyongyang. A presentation of flowers and bow by the group is customary here (5 EUR). Please note this is a governmentadministered sight and visits are subject to cancellation. Visits are optional and require a certain dress code (close-toed shoes and covered legs and shoulders). Here we will also see the <u>Chollima Monument</u>, or 'thousand ri (400 km or 250 mile) horse' -a symbol of speed- commemorating the quick rebuilding of the country in the 1950s following the Korean War
- Okryugwan | A meal at Pyongyang's most famous restaurant. Housed in a huge traditional building on the banks of the Taedong River. Okryugwan specialises in Pyongyang Cold Noodles.

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- <u>Tower of the Juche Idea</u> | Iconic tower dedicated to the DPRK's guiding philosophy on the Taedong River. Take the elevator to the top for great views of the city (*elevator ticket is 5 EUR*).
- <u>Monument to Party Foundation</u> | Iconic structure featuring the hammer, sickle, writing brush which represent the workers, farmers, and intellectuals that make up the Worker's Party of Korea.
- <u>Munsu Water Park</u> | We'll take a break at this outdoor and indoor water park with water slides, lap pools, and hot tubs. Bar, coffee shop, and shops for non-swimmers (*Entry fee 2 EUR; swimming fee- 10 EUR with suit rental; tennis- 5 EUR*).
- <u>Taedonggang Number 3 Beer Bar</u> | End the tour with a couple of pints of Taedonggang Beer in this local bar, you've earned it after this New Year!

JANUARY 2 – SUNDAY

Pyongyang, Sariwon, Kaesong

AM

• <u>Kumsusan Palace of the Sun</u> | Mausoleum of the DPRK leadership where President Kim II Sung and Leader Kim Jong II lie in state and the most solemn location on the itinerary. *Please note formal dress is required. Men require collared shirt with tie, dark non-jean pants, and dark shoes. Women require covered shoulders, knee-length dress or pants, and closed toed shoes. The visit will take most of the morning and*



visitors are asked to bow a number of times inside. This is a state-administered site and visits are subject to local conditions. Cancellations are rare but possible.

• <u>Trolleybus Ride</u> | A ride through Pyongyang from Pyongyang Railway Station to Arch of Triumph on one of the city's famous trolleybuses. A Koryo exclusive!

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- <u>Monument to the Three-Charters of National Reunification</u> | Iconic arch over the Pyongyang-Kaesong Highway dedicated to joint meeting between Koreas, north and south. Also known as the 'Arch of Reunification'.
- Drive to <u>Sariwon City</u> (1 hour) | Provincial Capital to the south of Pyongyang
- <u>Sariwon Folk Village</u> | With an amazing mountain viewpoint over the city, also try the <u>homemade Makgeoli!</u>
- Drive south to <u>Kaesong</u>, historic capital of the medieval <u>Koryo Dynasty</u> (918-1392 AD). Once located in South Korea, the city changed hands during the Korean War. It is now located just north of the DMZ.

Overnight | <u>Janamsan Hotel</u>, Kaesong | Used at various times by all three of the DPRK's national Leaders! This is a fun and retro hotel in a peaceful part of historic Kaesong

JANUARY 3 – MONDAY

Kaesong, DMZ, Pyongyang

AM

- Janam Hill and Old City View | Statues of the DPRK leadership on a hill overlooking Kaesong city and historic pavilion used for archery demonstrations in days of yore.
- <u>Old City Walk and South Gate</u> | A stroll from the hotel through Kaesong's historic district lined with homes dating back to the Ri Dynasty from the city's historic South Gate.
- <u>Panmunjom Armistice Village and DMZ</u> | The site of the signing of the 1953 armistice that ended the Korean War and demarcation line between north and south. On some days it is possible to visit the hut straddling the line, where negotiations between both sides once took place. Here we will be accompanied by military guides from the Korean People's Army.



- <u>Kaesong Korean Stamp Exhibition Hall</u> | Store selling stamps, postcards, local *ginseng*, souvenirs, art, and more! One of the best postcard collections in/ the country and friendly staff.
- <u>Kaesong Koryo Museum</u> | Once the Songgyung Academy, a Confucian school, and now a museum on the Koryo Dynasty exhibiting historical objects, statues, pagodas, and porcelain from that era. A UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- <u>Traditional Royal Korean Lunch (*pangsanggi*)</u> A meal consisting of 12 dishes served in brass bowls fit for the kings of old. The more dishes, the more distinguished the guest! Traditional Korean 'sweet-meat soup' is also an option here (+5 EUR).

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- **Pyongyang** | Drive back to the capital.
- <u>Foreign Languages Bookshop</u> | Store selling Korean publications translated into English, German, French, Russian, Chinese, and Spanish. Also pick up DVDs, postcards, and small works of art.
- <u>Kim II Sung Square</u> | Pyongyang's central square lined with government ministries, museums, and The Grand People's Study House.
- <u>Grand People's Study House</u> | Huge national library and public university housed in a large neo-traditional Korean building overlooking Kim II Sung Square and the downtown Pyongyang.
- Farewell dinner at <u>Pyongyang Duck Barbeque Restaurant</u> | South Pyongyang's famous grilled duck restaurant that has seen many a teary-eyed farewell.

JANUARY 4 – TUESDAY

Departure Day from Pyongyang and Return to Beijing by flight or train. Please indicate your preferred exit method upon booking. For this tour, we highly recommend train departure or at least leaving your schedule flexible for train departure to Beijing.

• Flight departure from Pyongyang on **Air Koryo Flight JS151** at 08:35 with scheduled arrival at Beijing Capital Airport (PEK) Terminal 2 at 09:55. ***Please note this flight is subject to cancellation.***



OR

• Train departure by **train to Beijing** at 10:25 with transfer in Dandong. The scheduled arrival is to **Beijing Station** on Wednesday, January 5 at 08:40. *For this tour the default option is hard sleeper (six beds per berth).*
